

DR. REASON

Dr. James William Reason, Hilliard's oldest general practitioner, who last August celebrated his 50th anniversary as a physician, died Thursday at the home of his foster-daughter, Dr. Jessie Jasper, 149 E. 13th Av. He was 76.

Dr. Reason was a graduate of the old Starling Medical College in the class of 1895, after which he at once began his practice in

Born on a farm on the banks of the Big Darby just west of Hilliard, he spent most of his early days in West Jefferson. He was graduated from Reynoldsburg High School and Ohio Northern University. For five years he taught school and then entered medical college.

Dr. Reason served on the Hilliard School Board for 48 years and was serving his second term on the Franklin County School Board.

He had been an associate of the medical department of University Hospital for many years, a member of the Columbus Academy of Medicine, the Ohio State Medical Association, the American Medical Association and the Association of Physicians and Surgeons.

In addition to his medical affiliations, Dr. Reason was past master of F & A M of Hilliard, a member of the Scottish Rite and the Shrine. He also was vice president of the Merchants and Farmers Bank of Hilliard and a member of the Hilliard Methodist Church.

Besides his foster-daughter, he is survived by a brother, John Frederick Reason, 76 W. Northwood Av, and a niece, Mrs. James Alloway, 357 W. 10th Av.
